

**NOTICE OF PETITION FOR CHANGE, PETITION FOR SPLIT,
AND PETITION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME,
FOR WATER RIGHT PERMIT 11319 (APPLICATION 17002) OF
ALAMEDA COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT
(ZONE 7)**

COUNTY: Alameda

STREAM SYSTEM: Arroyo del Valle

On June 11, 2024, Wagner and Bonsignore Consulting Civil Engineers filed petitions on behalf of Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, Zone 7 (Zone 7), to split water right Permit 11319 (Application 17002), add direct diversion to and license one portion of the permit, and replace a pending petition for time extension with a new request for 30-year time extension on the remaining unlicensed portion of the permit with the State Water Resources Control Board, Division of Water Rights (Division).

Permit 11319 allowed until December 31, 2007, to complete application of the water to the proposed uses. Zone 7 has requested licensing of a portion of Permit 11319 during the petition process to split the right. The portion of the permit to be considered for licensing and adding direct diversion is specific to diversion/rediversion and storage in Lake del Valle. The remaining portion of the permit and time extension is specific to the diversion/rediversion and diversion to underground storage in the "Chain of Lakes" project.

Existing: Up to 60,000 acre-feet per annum (AFA) of storage when combined with Permit 11320 of Alameda County Water District.

Proposed Change:

Permit 11319A – Pending license investigation, 7,444 AFA storage in Lake del Valle and 43 cubic feet per second (10,729 AFA) by direct diversion requested by this change petition.

Permit 11319B – Up to 41,827 AFA by rediversion to groundwater storage or directly diverted to groundwater storage at a rate of up to 250 cubic feet per second.

Purposes of Use:

Existing: Municipal, Domestic, Irrigation, Industrial and Recreational

Proposed Change:
No Changes

Place of Use:

Existing: Within the entire service area of the South Bay Aqueduct of the State Department of Water Resources comprising the service areas of Santa Clara County Flood Control and Water District, Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, Zone 7, and Alameda County Water District, all within Township 1 South to Township 12 South, Range 7 East to Range 3 West, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian.

Proposed Change:
No Changes

The proposed changes to Permit 11319 will not affect the rights of Alameda County Water District under its Permit 11320 (Application 17003), which shares a joint cumulative diversion limit of 60,000 AFA with Permit 11319 (Application 17002).

Time Extension:

Petitioner requests a 30-year time extension for the proposed “B” Portion of Permit 11319 that relates to the rediversion to storage in Zone 7’s Chain of Lakes project. The requested time is to make full beneficial use of the water in light of the timing constraints surrounding use of the Chain of Lakes. This current time extension request replaces Zone 7’s previous unissued 30-year time extension request for the entire permit that was publicly noticed on June 3, 2010.

Pursuant to California Water Code section 1703.1, any interested person may file a protest to the proposed changes. Protests filed in response to this notice should be submitted to the persons listed below and must be received by the Division by 4:30 p.m. on **December 20, 2024**. Protests may be provided via email prior to the deadline; however, a copy of the original signed letter of protest must be subsequently filed with the Division.
