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Introduction

Welcome to the Cannabis Cultivation General Order and Small Irrigation Use Registration Portal. This application allows cannabis cultivators to apply for coverage under the State Water Resources Control Board General Waste Discharge Requirements and Waiver of Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Waste Associated with Cannabis Cultivation Activities (Cannabis Cultivation General Order) and to file for a water right registration for Small Irrigation Use for Cannabis Cultivation. The portal consists of the following sections

- Section B: Screening questions to determine if you need and are eligible for a small irrigation use water right registration.

Your answers to the questions in this portal will help determine if you need coverage under the Cannabis Cultivation General Order, a Small Irrigation Use water right registration, both, or neither. The Cannabis Cultivation Policy allows cultivators to request an exemption from certain flow requirements if the spring being used for cannabis cultivation meets a set of pre-determined conditions. Cannabis cultivators requesting an exemption must obtain a Cannabis Small Irrigation Use Registration (Cannabis SIUR), and include supporting evidence regarding the fully contained spring (Fully Contained Spring Report). Section B - Water Storage Method

ONSTREAM DAM is a structure in a stream channel or spring that impedes or blocks the passage of water, sediment, woody debris, or fish Onstream dams can directly impact salmonids if they prevent fish passage and block access to upstream spawning and rearing habitats. Onstream dams can intercept and retain:

- 1. Spring and summer flows without providing bypass flows,
- 2. Sediments/gravels that would otherwise replenish downstream spawning gravels, and
- 3. Large wood that would otherwise provide downstream habitat structure.

- For onstream storage reservoirs constructed after October 1, 2016, the diverter must obtain an appropriative water right permit with irrigation as a designated use prior to diverting water.
- Onstream storage obtained under a small domestic use registration, livestock stockpond use registration, or stockpond certificate, cannot be used for commercial cannabis cultivation unless the diverter obtains a Cannabis Small Irrigation Use Registration under option 2 or 3 above.

If the following conditions are met the State Water Board's Cannabis Cultivation Policy allows diverters with onstream reservoirs to obtain ϵ Cannabis Small Irrigation Use Registration (Cannabis SIUR) that covers the continued operation and use of the onstream reservoir for irrigation of commercial cannabis.

- a. The onstream reservoir existed prior to October 1, 2016. Please note, you must provide evidence that the reservoir meets this condition as part of this application. Examples of evidence include time-stamped aerial imagery, property deed or other transfer of ownership information that document the reservoir, construction and installation receipts, etc. Please upload the evidence for your onstream reservoir at the bottom of this page.
- b. The registrant requests a determination from the Deputy Director of the Division of Water Rights, henceforth referred to as Deputy Director, or the designee for the Deputy Director, and California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) to determine whether removal of the reservoir or installation of off-stream storage would cause more environmental damage than continuing to use the existing onstream reservoir(s) for diversion and storage.
- c. The registrant accepts any conditions imposed by the Deputy Director (or designee) and CDFW before or after issuance of the Cannabis SIUR as part of determinations to ensure any modifications and ongoing operation of the onstream reservoir are protectiv of water quality and aquatic resources. If the Deputy Director (or designee) or CDFW determine the existing onstream reservoir doe not meet this condition:
 - i. The reservoir and associated facilities shall be removed or otherwise modified such that the reservoir is incapable of storing water; and
 - ii. The cannabis cultivator shall either install off-stream storage or obtain an alternative source of water or water right.
- d. The onstream reservoir operates or will be modified to:
 - i. Bypass all inflow to the reservoir during the surface water diversion forbearance period established per Section 3,
 Requirement 4 of the Cannabis Cultivation Policy. This requirement may be modified by the Deputy Director (or designee) or CDFW as part of the determination and Cannabis SIUR;
 - ii. Comply with the diversion rate and diversion season bypass conditions (pursuant to Section 3, Requirements 5, 6, and 7 of the Cannabis Cultivation Policy). This requirement may be modified by the Deputy Director (or designee) or CDFW as part of the determinations of the Cannabis SIUR; and
 - iii. Operate consistent with other requirements of the Cannabis Cultivation Policy. This requirement may be modified by the Deputy Director (or designee) as part of the determinations and Cannabis SIUR.
- e. Within six months of the determinations, the diverter shall submit a compliance plan for review and approval by the Deputy Director (or designee). The compliance plan shall clearly identify the scope of work and schedule for completion of modifications necessary to operate the onstream reservoir in compliance with the determinations and Cannabis SIUR. The schedule for completion must comply with the timeline established by the Deputy Director (or designee) and shall not exceed the renewal date of the Cannabis SIUR Certificate. The Deputy Director (or designee) may require modifications prior to approving the draft compliance plan.
- f. Withdrawal of water from the onstream reservoir for cannabis cultivation activities is only allowed during the surface water diversion forbearance period.
- g. Install and maintain a measuring device in the onstream reservoir to monitor and record the date, time, and volume of water diverted to the reservoir at an hourly or more frequent basis. Please refer to Attachment A, Section 2, Requirement 83 of the State Water Board's Cannabis Cultivation Policy for the full text of the onstream reservoir measurement requirements and specifications.

In addition to the conditions detailed above, the State Water Board may impose conditions for each individual Cannabis SIUR for an onstream reservoir to:

- a. Ensure that individual and cumulative effects of water diversion and discharge associated with cultivation do not affect the instream flows needed for fish spawning, migration, and rearing, and the flows needed to maintain natural flow variability;
- b. Ensure that cultivation does not negatively impact springs, riparian habitat, wetlands, or aquatic habitat, and
- c. Otherwise protect fish, wildlife, fish and wildlife habitat, and water quality.

Each Cannabis SIUR filing for an onstream reservoir shall include self-certification that the registrant has agreed to comply with all lawful conditions required by the State Water Board.

The State Water Resources Control Board is empowered to require the submission of personal identifying information by California Water Code sections 1228 and 13260. The submission of the name, address, and phone number of the diverter/discharger and person filing for SIUR and General Order coverage is mandatory. The submission of the e-mail address of the diverter/discharger and person filing for SIUR and General Order coverage is voluntary. Failure to provide the mandatory information for SIUR coverage can result in the imposition of administrative civil liability in the amount of \$500 and an additional \$250 per day for each additional day on which the violation continues if the person fails to cure the violation within 30 days after the State Water Resources Control Board has called the violation to the attention of the person. Failure to provide the mandator information for General Order coverage can result in the imposition of administrative civil liability in the amount of \$1,000 per day

This personal identifying information is collected to facilitate better water management and waste discharge management by the State Water Resources Control Board. The State Water Resources Control Board will not automatically post personal identifying information to public databases. However, the State Water Resources Control Board may be legally required to disclose personal identifying information under any of the circumstances described in Civil Code, section 1798.24. Such circumstances may include, but are not limited to, responding to a request pursuant to the California Public Records Act or responding to a subpoena from a federal agency.
