PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY UPPER NORTH FORK FEATHER RIVER HYDROELECTRIC PROJECT FEDERAL ENERGY REGULATORY COMMISSION PROJECT NO. 2105

Project Description

The Upper North Fork Feather River Hydroelectric Project (UNFFR Project) involves the issuance of a water quality certification (certification) as part of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) relicensing of Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E's) existing UNFFR Project located on the North Fork Feather River in Plumas County, California. The purpose of the certification is to ensure the UNFFR Project complies with the water quality standards of the North Fork Feather River and its tributaries, as identified in the *Water Quality Control Plan for the Sacramento and San Joaquin River Basins* (Basin Plan). The water quality standards are comprised of the beneficial uses and water quality objectives identified in the Basin Plan, as well as state and federal anti-degradation requirements.

On October 23, 2002, PG&E filed an application for a new license for the UNFFR Project, also known as FERC Project No. 2105. The UNFFR Project encompasses more than 30,000 acres including three reservoirs, part of the North Fork Feather River and part of Butt Creek. The three reservoirs are: Lake Almanor (created by Canyon dam on the North Fork Feather River); Butt Valley reservoir (created by Butt Valley dam on Butt Creek); and Belden forebay (created by Belden dam on the North Fork Feather River downstream of its confluence with Butt Creek). The North Fork Feather River within the UNFFR Project boundary consists of two reaches: 1) the Seneca reach; and 2) the Belden reach. The Seneca reach extends from Canyon dam to Belden forebay, and the Belden reach extends from Belden dam downstream to the tailrace of Belden powerhouse.

When issuing a certification, the State Water Board Resources Control Board (State Water Board) must comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The State Water Board is the CEQA lead agency and is required to evaluate PG&E's Proposed UNFFR Project and its effects before taking action on PG&E's request for certification.

The Environmental Impact Report (EIR) evaluates PG&E's Proposed UNFFR Project as well as two alternatives. For purposes of the CEQA analysis, the Proposed UNFFR Project consists of operation of the Proposed UNFFR Project under a new FERC license in accordance with PG&E's application to FERC, a partial settlement agreement¹ between PG&E and numerous stakeholders, conditions proposed by the National Marine Fisheries Service pursuant to section 18 of the Federal Power Act, conditions proposed by the United States Forest Service pursuant to section 4(e) of the Federal Power Act, and FERC's Staff Alternative as outlined in Chapter 3 of the EIR². Alternatives 1 and 2 are described in detail in Chapter 4 of the EIR. Generally, both Alternatives 1 and 2 involve construction of thermal curtains at the Prattville and Caribou intakes and the activities outlined in the Proposed UNFFR Project, with relatively minor modifications to the minimum flow releases from Canyon Dam to the Seneca and Belden reaches of the North Fork Feather River. Alternative 1 also includes an increase in releases from the low level outlet at Canyon dam of up to 250 cubic feet per second from June 15 to September 15 to improve temperatures in the North Fork Feather River.

Among other things, the Proposed UNFFR Project consists of higher minimum instream flows which vary depending upon

water year type, recreational enhancement measures, and fishery management measures.




Figure 1-1 Vicinity Map
